Epiphany is that time in our church year when we get to know Jesus as God-come-among-us. Because we can not see God, Jesus is our lens for seeing, a kind of portrait of God that we humans turn to in order to understand what God is like, what God's purposes are, what God longs for in this creation.

As the three wise men came to meet Jesus, so do we. We believe that we can always know Jesus better, as we mature in our experiences, as the world changes, by the Spirit's presence epiphanies (revelations) of God come home to us differently.

In our worship together we will give thanks as we always do, for the gift of sharing in Christ's life and seeing more clearly God's life in our world AND our calling. As we come to the communion table during these weeks of Epiphany, you will see that we have included the most ancient dialogue and prayer of the church that comes before the words of institution.

This section of our worship is both a prayer and a dialogue between the pastor and the congregation. We bind ourselves to each other and to God as we draw near to Jesus who forged this connection for us for all eternity. We are reminded to turn as fully as we humans can toward God ("lift up your hearts. We lift them to the Lord") and we follow Jesus' example of thanking God before we share bread and wine.

The words are in all settings of the communion in the ELW and we will also have them on the screen. O come, let us worship the Lord.

As the need is ongoing, your continued support of the ELCA Mission effort is greatly appreciated.

We have moved into Phase 3 of the call process. In this phase, "Calling a New Pastor," the committee works to identify and recommend a new pastor.

On December 12th, our St. Paul Area Synod representative met with the Committee and gave us four names of potential pastoral candidates.

We spent time going over the candidate profiles, history and experience. In this age of digital technology, the committee also had the opportunity to view candidates in action at their current ministry sites.

The Committee completed the first round of interviews just before Christmas. One candidate stood out from the rest. The committee is looking forward to a second interview with this candidate in early January.

Thank you for your continued support and prayers as the committee continues to discern God's work with thoughtfulness and care.

2023 Offering Envelope Update

The vendor that supplies our offering envelopes has advised that machinery breakdowns, repair parts shortages and a lack of available seasonal workers, have created a severe backlog of envelope orders waiting to be printed and shipped. They estimate that we might not receive our order until late February.

We realize that for many of us these offering envelopes are an important part of our worship. Here are some suggestions that will help us get by while we await the arrival of the 2023 envelopes:

- * Use the blank envelopes that are now available in the pocket on the back of each pew.
- * Pickup a bundle of blank envelopes on the table in the Narthex for future use.
- * Repurpose any offering envelopes you may have left over from last year at home.
- Consider making online donations using the link on our website: www.ctkwbl.org.

When using replacement envelopes, please be sure to enter your name, date, donation amount, check number and special gift information on the outside of the envelope. If you know your member number, add that to the envelope as well. Adding these details reduces the burden for the counting team members and allows us to properly record your donation in our member data base. This ensures that your statement of giving, which is used for tax return preparation, is accurate.
