As we prepare the Easter worship services, we decided to write and share the blessings with you. Our Choirs are busy preparing Easter songs. Its our hope that you are doing the same. As we pray for our members here we also pray for you so that Jesus' resurrection can bring more hope to all of us.

Beside this Easter greetings we would like to update you about our projects. We thank you for your support which helped us to finish the construction of the parsonage, the Evangelist houses at Lupilo and Mbawi preaching points. Thank you also for buying us a Parish Motorcycle which is very helpful in our ministry. Thank you for the scholarship funds which is helping our children to accomplish their dreams.

It is rain season here so people are super busy with their farms. Most of them they grow, potatoes, pees, beans and wheat. They also plant pine trees and fruit's trees especially Avocados.

For the time being our priorities as a parish are:

- 1. Construction of Tumaini church building which now we are collecting stones for the foundation.
- 2. Planting Avocado trees. Through preaching points we have already planted 180 avocado trees. As a parish we have purchased three acres of land which will be used to plant Avocado trees as well.

We need your prayers for the following:

- 1. Pray for the parish to get a good pastor who will stay longer.
- 2. Pray for many youths and children to love the church and be involved to the church activities for the future of our parish.
- 3. Pray for our plans and projects for be fruitful for the glory of God.
