Dear Siblings in Christ,

We are entering into a new season: the season of new beginnings as summer winds down and we begin fall. 

Gardening and Prayer By Mike Stepan

Dad had a magnificent rock and flower garden, and a vegetable one. He always said that he felt close to God there, and me, because I was encouraged to "stay awake" with him—helping him tend the garden, e.g., preparing the soil, planting, weeding, feeding, watering, and moving rocks for some new aesthetically pleasing configuration.

But Dad treated gardening like a prayer. Indeed, it was a prayer. He taught me to do so, too, even when I did not particularly feel like it.

Often, we did not speak much during this time in the garden, but I now appreciate that it was a sacred time to be with my father and God. The quietness, the comfort of the proximity and presence of my father, our two gentle St. Bernards calmly waiting for us to finish, and the beauty of nature surrounding us, including a vast variety of brilliantly colored flowers and bushes, and hummingbirds and honeybees at the blossoms, all providing the soil for thoughtful reflection and prayer-filled time—and for bearing fruit. And sometimes, when the need arose, our time bore fruit. And sometimes, when the need arose, our time together provided me with an opportunity to visit in private with Dad about those things most important or concerning in my life—just like I do now, with God.

Looking back, I realize—with the help of some great spiritual mentors—that Dad helped teach me to pray in a new, especially deep way. Now, I find that some of my most profound prayer experiences are those while I am surrounded by the beauty of Creation, e.g., on a quiet walk by the ocean or a lake, working in my yard, on a bike ride, hiking a Natural Park trail, or witnessing the power of a thunderstorm.

God invites us to take time for stillness and calmness, in the busy-ness of our modern, media-connected age. Each of us has such special places, perhaps in the tranquility of a garden, forest, or prairie, or while near the ocean's surf, or in the shadow of a majestic mountain, a quiet corner of our home, a church sanctuary, while gazing up at the stars on a clear night, while sitting near a fireplace or campfire—or perhaps with a dear friend or family member—anywhere and anytime that we can experience that quiet presence of God. And sometimes, our prayers may have no words that suffice or seem adequate — just spending that time together is a wondrous prayer. Indeed, as Paul assures us:

"Likewise, the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but that very Spirit intercedes with sighs too deep for words. And God, who searches the heart, knows the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God."
