"Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted." – Matthew 5:4


Dear Beloved in Christ,

We will mark All Saints Day on November 5 in worship as a day to remember those who have died over the last year and all those who have died before us. In our culture, it is unusual to acknowledge death so clearly. So often we even avoid using the word death or died, preferring to soften our language and say lost or passed. But as we reach All Saints Day this year, we can take some time to remember those who have died before us. To know that our lives were changed because of their love and care for us and the way that we offered our love and care back.

All Saints Day can be one of the times that might feel like a "thin space." "Thin space" is a term from Celtic Christianity that describes places where earth and heaven meet; holy spaces and places. We might experience this at church or while on retreat or

at a retreat center. Often this time of year in our geographic location can feel like a thin space. The days are shorter, the darkness is greater, and our connection to the great cloud of witnesses that surrounds us feels more present.

As we experience these thin spaces, grief may also be present as the death of a loved one continues to ripple in our lives. I remember the first time I had a family member die when I was an elementary-aged student. My grandmother, who I called Mummu (Finnish for grandmother), died unexpectedly in a car accident a week before Christmas. I loved my Mummu and was heart-broken that I no longer had her cheery warmth and enthusiastic hugs to greet



me when we visited my grandparents in Michigan. While many years have gone by since Mummu died and my grief has lifted, I am still sad that she was only present in my life for eight years. But as we mark All Saints Day, I remember her good cheer, love for me and her grandchildren, and her faith. These are qualities that I try to emulate in my life thanks to her witness.

All Saints Day is one day on the calendar when we remember the saints that surround us. These may be ordinary saints – grandparents, parents, siblings, friends, co-workers, teachers – or saints of history like St. Francis, St. Peter, Martin Luther King Jr., Mother Theresa, or Dorothy Day. However, why should we limit our remembering the saints to just one day? We are reminded that we around surrounded by a great cloud of witnesses each and every day. So why limit it to just one day of remembering these saints?

One of my colleagues, the Reverend Laura Stephens-Reed publishes a calendar of prompts for the month of November. She encourages reflecting on the way our lives are shaped by the many people who have joined in the cloud of witnesses, whether we knew them or not. She offers prompts for reflecting and giving thanks for

> the witness of the saints. A few that resonated with me include: "Reminded you how to see the world as a child," "Took you somewhere life changing," and "Pointed out your gifts." 


Abundant Generosity

When I was in college, I attended a multi-day retreat where the leader started the day's morning reflection with a thought-provoking question: "What does it mean to give until it hurts?" After a brief silence, he said, "I'll give you the best example: Christ on the Cross." Aside from several immediate gasps and sighs, you could have heard a pin drop in that sanctuary. I was stunned. In an instant, I was presented with profound understanding regarding John's gospel at 3:16: "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life." Suffice to say that we worship an abundantly generous God. When one thinks about it, everything we have, including the air in our lungs—with that breath you just took—came as a pure gift from God. Indeed, *what is* truly ours in a very real sense, save for our unique love of God and neighbor since everything has come to us from God's generosity? As Christians, we are encouraged to be similarly generous, especially with our gifts in ministry and our means. We're encouraged to think of others.

Jesus sent the disciples out to spread the Good News. "By your works they'll know you're from me," Jesus said (my paraphrase). How was he able to say it with such certainty, aside from being God? It's because he set the example—*thee* Example—with his life and his death. But he didn't send the disciples out blindly; he equipped them, just as we've been equipped to serve, to be gracious and generous through our good works, using our God-given gifts to serve each other and our neighbors.

We live in continually developing and sometimes challenging times, but I encourage you to see them as opportunities. Remember especially the poor in spirit, those challenged by illness, poverty, addiction, depression, exploitation, war, indeed, all those in need—in need's countless forms. In the recent words of Presiding Bishop Eaton, this is "God's Love Made Real."

Let our prayer be that the Holy Spirit helps us shine as disciples, and that we continue to encourage one another, with our gifts of caring, talent, and means - through Jesus Christ, Our Lord. Amen.
