Peace


Recently, I came across a quote highlighted on Bishop Michael Reinhart's website:



Regarding the budget, Treasurer Mike Nollan will be holding a budget review session on


Sunday, January 21st, after the service.

Masisiwe Good News

A group of engineering students from the U of M Design for Life class will be visiting Masisiwe on January 5-7, 2024. They will be led by a Mechanical Engineering professor in cooperation with Bega Kwa Bega, the St. Paul Area Synod partnership with the Iringa Diocese in Tanzania. Their goal will be to collect information to design a new water system to serve the Masiswe area village. They will make their presentation at the U of M on February 27th. The students will be taking along two suitcases of 90 bear dolls that we have knitted plus toy cars saved since the last team visited in 2013. The toys have a heart pined on that is printed "Christ the King Lutheran Church and YESU NI PENDO (Jesus Loves You)". We are very excited to have this opportunity to connect with the younger children of our sister congregation. Please pray for a safe and successful visit by the engineering students and their leader as they reach yet another remote area

that needs clean accessible water. In 11 years of

their program they have successfully completed water accessibility for over 20,000 residents. God bless our Masisiwe Ministry!
