## Pastor's Corner

"Here's my heart. Take and seal it. Seal it for thy courts above." - Come Thou Fount of Every Blessing

Dear Family in Christ,

This March marks the mid-point of our Lenten journey alongside Peter. We still have more time exploring Peter's experience as a disciple alongside Jesus and his faith journey. We've already heard stories of Peter's bold courageous faith and his fear and doubt, often seeing both expressed within the same stories. The rest of the season of Lent will feature more stories of Peter's wandering heart and his steadfast following of Jesus.

The last week of March will bring Holy Week into focus for us, beginning on March 24 with Palm Sunday. We'll wave palms and sing to remember Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem. Our cries of "Hosanna!" will cry forth as we witness to Jesus' ministry and his kingship. But we know that Palm Sunday is only the beginning of Holy Week and the start of Jesus' movement towards the cross.

Holy Week will begin in earnest on March 28 with a Maundy Thursday service as we gather just as Jesus' disciples did for a final meal, focusing on communion as a gift that Jesus leaves for us as he prepares for his crucifixion. We will also remember that Jesus washed feet to serve his disciples. Love is poured out over the disciples and over us too, as Jesus served the disciples through this tender act of love. We will remember Jesus' final loving act of service and pray that we might echo Jesus in serving one another and living with love.

Worship will continue on March 29 as we mark Good Friday with a service focusing on Peter and his response to Jesus' crucifixion. The Fools for

Christ will present dramatic readings of the Good Friday gospel as we remember Jesus' death. Peter will be our companion and focus for this year's Good Friday service, giving us an opportunity to imagine how we might have behaved if we had been there as one of Jesus' followers and friends.

Easter Sunday will again be a festive day complete with all the wonderful musical offerings CTK has to offer. Our Easter theme will be "And I hope..." as we witness the women experience the empty tomb and Peter running to the tomb to see with his own eyes the absence of Jesus. We're invited to live in wonder this Easter, wonder of how our faith in Christ's resurrection can truly change the world.

The three worship services that make up Holy Week – Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Easter Sunday – is actually one continuous worship service that can also be referred to as the Triduum, a Latin root that means "three days." If you attend all three services, you may notice that both Maundy Thursday and Good Friday do not end in the traditional way with a sending. Worship continues the very next day – only to end on Easter Sunday as we celebrate Jesus' resurrection and proclaim "Alleluia! Christ is risen!"

I hope to see you at all three of the Triduum services at CTK this year as we experience the highs and lows of Peter's faith journey and experience a sense of wonder in the familiar story being retold yet again.

We did manage to do some business.

- We approved a fundraising request by Bill Hughes. He would like to raise some money to purchase vegetable seeds for people in the Ukraine. More information will be coming in March. Please consider supporting this ministry.
- We approved committing our Lenten offerings • for Habitat for Humanity. This has been a long-standing tradition. Once again our annual commitment is \$3,500.

The council did some planning for its March retreat where we are looking to set some short term and long term goals. The council will be taking a new look at our vision and mission statements. As we follow Peter this Lent, we'll see how Jesus is present at each step: offering him abundance, catching him when he begins to sink, challenging him when he stands in the way, washing his feet, predicting his betray, and offering him love (agape). We join with Peter in figuring out faith this Lent. As we wander alongside Peter, we open ourselves to what we might learn about Jesus and ourselves by stepping into Peter's shoes. ## Our Companion Peter

While our hearts have been wandering with our Lenten devotional, I have especially appreciated that we have a good example of a faithful disciple in Peter. For me, it is because Peter is such a good example of being human and someone with whom I can identify, e.g., caring, dedicated, serving, impatient, humble, joyful, fearful, passionate, doubting, stumbling, but forgiving, and in need of forgiveness – gracious, grateful, generous, and willing to learn.

One of my favorite scriptures is chapter 6 of John's gospel, where, among many other things, Jesus feeds five thousand men, plus women and children, and where Jesus said, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." John 6:35. This, and some other things Jesus was about to say, upset some of his followers and the religious leaders of the time.

Jesus then said, "It is the spirit that gives life; the flesh is useless. The words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But among you there are some who do not believe." For Jesus knew from the beginning who were the ones who did not believe and who was the one who would betray him. And he said, "For this reason I have told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted by the Father." John 6:64-65.

Because of this many of his disciples turned back and no longer went about with him. So, Jesus asked the twelve, "Do you also wish to go away?" Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom can we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and know that you are the Holy One of God." John 6:66-69. Can you hear Peter speaking those words? You can almost hear the intonation.

Peter demonstrated his willingness to learn and to believe in such a way that he felt compelled to profess – to share his faith. Although Peter would later deny Christ three times in proximity to crucifixion, faithful Peter is believed to have ultimately died as a martyr for his faith.

Redeeming God, we thank you for the example of Peter. May we be good examples of faith to others. We pray this in the name of Jesus. Amen.
